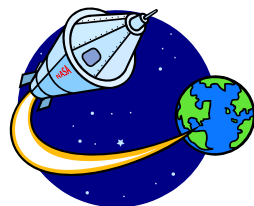
### **Blogs, Wikis, RSS – What Can They Do For Me?**

### **Serials Projects Made Simple(r)**

Provides some recommendations about priorities, decision-making, organization, and methodology for serials collections.
