Library computing generates log files, which are chock-full of useful information. Using Event logs, Webserver logs, Sirsi logs and logs from other library software such as EZproxy, you can monitor trends in usage, identify authentication problems, gather statistics and see security threats.

You can use your Sirsi logs to find out who waived those fines, what books got accidentally deleted from the catalog and which student worker handled that particular transaction at the Circulation Desk -- all without programming knowledge, expensive software packages or API.
